At first thought it may seem that all participants (with the exception of the tribunal) involved in the resolution of a dispute through arbitration would have the same goal in mind - to win the day. And while this may be true superficially, as we dig beneath the surface we find that the different players - party, counsel, experts, fact witnesses, etc. - each have different, and sometimes conflicting, views on the situation, and oftentimes differing agendas. In this talk we will examine the arbitration process through the eyes of a protagonist, and provide insight into the thought processes of the business person, which, at times, may be unfathomable to those in the legal profession. The talk will also give business persons an overview of the practicalities of managing an arbitration proceeding.

Mr. James Booker - Vice President, Operations & Project Development, Paiton Energy

James' involvement in dispute resolution began in 1998 when, as Paiton's representative, he became intimately involved in 3 major international arbitrations, a mediation and an expert determination, which took up much of his time over a period of almost 6 years. James has a BSc, an MBA, a Postgraduate Diploma in International Commercial Arbitration, and recently completed the King's/NUS MSc in Construction Law & Arbitration. He is a Chartered Civil Engineer, a Fellow of the SIArb, a Member of the CIArb, and is on the BANI Panel of Arbitrators and on the SIAC Reserve Arbitrator list.
