



THE USE OF ADVANCED FORENSIC ANIMATIONS IN THE RESOLUTION OF COMPLEX DISRUPTION CLAIMS

Thursday 29th November 2007

The Talk:-

The use of electronically produced evidence is a relatively new development in dispute resolution. Little case law is available to support its admissibility, but recent US developments and the Bloody Sunday enquiry in the UK have helped to provide a background into how and when electronically produced exhibits may be admitted as evidence.

The aim of using advanced computer animation is to help in the interpretation, communication and understanding of complex factual scenarios. The animations can be compiled into auto-run or interactive stand alone presentations, integrated into powerpoint presentations and high-resolution still images can also be exported to enhance the visual contents of reports.

This paper, which was first given at the inaugural meeting of the 4-Counties branch of the SCL in England, in March 2007, will explore what can be achieved by the use of 3D and 4D animations in the proof of causation in complex delay and disruption scenarios.

Keith is an architect with a legal education. He has over 25 years experience as an architect in his own multi-disciplinary practice, of which amongst other things, 10 years were spent in construction management. Since 1976, he has received over 400 party appointments and one high court appointment as an expert and has acted as an Arbitrator, Adjudicator or Mediator on over 80 occasions. He is the author of "Delay and Disruption in Construction Contracts" (3rd Ed, 2005), "Delay and Disruption On-Line" (2007, Updated, Informa), contributing editor of "Construction Law and Management" (2007, Informa) and a number of articles in technical and legal journals. He regularly contributes to conferences on delay related issues in construction, civil engineering and IT. He now practices from Hong Kong as an expert, arbitrator and adjudicator on disputes in construction, civil engineering, oil and gas, shipping and IT industries; and as a consultant in the pro-active management of time-related risks.
