THE SPEAKERS:-

Ms Finola O'Farrell QC

Finola O'Farrell QC was called to the Bar in 1983 and is a practicing barrister, adjudicator and mediator at construction law specialists barristers set Keating Chambers. She specializes in construction, engineering, energy and technology disputes and has acted on a wide range of international arbitrations including matters relating to shipbuilding in Western Europe, infrastructure projects in the Middle East and oil rig construction in the Far East.

Although increasingly involved in international arbitration work since taking Silk in 2002, Miss O'Farrell QC continues to appear in reported cases in the United Kingdom. Her work has included litigations concerning major rail infrastructure contracts, defects in a fire training facility, claims arising from the Wembley Stadium development and an expert determination in respect of a PFI contract. Miss O'Farrell has also acted in adjudications and mediations on various construction and engineering developments.

Mr. Simon Hughes

Simon Hughes has also been a Member of Keating Chambers since 1996, and has rapidly acquired an impressive practice acting in a large number of substantial high profile disputes in the United Kingdom and overseas.

Mr Hughes work has included disputes relating various to power generation, utilities, process plants, shipbuilding, mining and other construction and engineering projects around the world. These disputes have been conducted in litigation (Technology and Construction Court, Commercial Court and Companies Court), domestic and international arbitration and adjudication. He has been involved in disputes involving most standard form contracts used for substantial projects including the JCT standard forms, ICE 5th and 6th editions, the NEC, IChemE Green and Red Book, FIDIC forms, and derivative standard form agreements.

Michael Furmston is Dean of Law at Singapore Management University.
